

All About Some Personal Experiences With MGB Tires by Pete Carss

While returning from Rockland to Orleans recently, doing about 80 or 90 kph, my left rear tire failed catastrophically, the tread separating from the carcass and wrapping around the axle, compressing the parking brake cable which locked both rear wheels, sending me into an abrupt 360 degree spin and headed toward a rather deep ditch. Fortunately the car stopped on the edge of the ditch, and avoided oncoming rush hour traffic. After collecting my wits and returning my heart from my throat to my chest, I got my spare on and extracted the car from the soft shoulder, driving the rest of the way home at a very moderate pace. (I suspect the spare is the original that came with the car!) The tires look great, lots of tread, but are obviously not safe. Long story short, our cars may be vintage, but our tires should not be! Safety Fast! Pete




Did you know: If you look at the sidewall of your tires you will notice numbers, letters and codes everywhere. These codes include the location, month and year your tire was manufactured.

Look for a four-digit code on the sidewall of your tire. The first two digits of the code tell you what week of the year the tire was made and the last two the year.

The tires in the picture were made in the 39th week of 2017 – so late September.

Keep in mind that rubber gets harder over time - even just sitting on a tire rack - due to things like the ozone in the air, exposure to sunshine, heat, etc. Tires have a 'Best Before' date and that lasts for 5 years after they are made. Keep that in mind when shopping for new ones. One day after the 5 years is up doesn't mean the tire is no longer able to be used, just that the harder rubber is prone to cracking, allowing moisture into the fabric material underneath the rubber protective coating. Also that the grip is very much reduced - even more critical in the colder weather. Even though there might still be lots of tread left, that tire is not able to do its job and that translates into reduced safety while driving.

Election of Executive Committee 2020-2021

As the Annual General Meeting looms on the horizon, it's time to start thinking about electing the next Executive Committee. The OMGC Succession Plan that came into effect at the AGM in November 2017 states that, technically, all members of the Executive retire at the AGM. Incumbent members can put their names forward for election for a further term. If other members put their names forward, and if more than one member puts their name forward for a vacant position, voting takes place by show of hands at the meeting. Making it clear members can stand against an incumbent as well as for a vacant position — although unlikely that anyone will, esp. for Treasurer, Membership, Webmaster. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, terms are for 2 years. Clarification as we have some 1 and some 2 year terms this time.

Here is the current status of the Executive Portfolios:

<u>Treasurer</u> – Trevor Whitehouse, second 2 year term

Membership Director – Catherine Blair, second 2 year term

Webmaster - Robert Giroux, final 1 year term to oversee the implementation of the new website.

Regalia Director – Julia Fortey, second 2 year term

<u>Communications Director</u> – vacant – Len has been on the Executive for many years, and will continue to actively support the Executive as a volunteer.

Technical Director - vacant

<u>ABCD Representative</u> – vacant – The person in this position will not be required to attend Executive Committee meetings.

Member At Large – Mike Turnbull is moving out of the immediate area and does not wish to stand for a second 2 year term this portfolio is being deemed no longer required.

Unfortunately, Mike Westland will not be able to take on the role of President for 2020/2021 due to increased work responsibilities. The Executive Committee therefore agreed to a proposal that Trish Adams stay on as President for another year. This proposal will be presented at the AGM in November and your support will be requested.

The Vice President elected at the AGM in November 2019 will serve a 1 year term, and take over as President at the AGM in November 2020 for the usual 2 year term (2021/2022)

A new Vice President will be elected for a 2 year term (2021/2022) at the November 2020 AGM
