To say he has repaired, fixed up or restored several British cars would be an understatement: 23 MGBs, 7 Jaguars & now is half way through his 2nd MG-TD restoration. His rented workshop is one-half of an old milking-barn (ground & upper floor). And Mike tells me his landlord is a great guy, and a graphic artist who works for a sign company that does vehicle wraps & big signs. Mike also says his landlord is spectacular with wood, and has the other end of the barn for his hobbies and property maintenance work. One day, when Mike came to the shop to put in time on the restoration, he found this great sign on the shelf. The sign has, as its background, a map of the world.... barely visible. This "Its A Mystery" is different from the first four games, because this game has many individual opportunities to view pictures and answer questions about the pictures and/or the events and/or the people and places involved. But you can do them one at a time, at your leisure.

There are 26 groups of pictures: group A through group Z; each group has 2 pictures to examine. Each group of two pictures has three questions about the pictures/events/circumstances.

So, to participate, all you have to do is to send an e-mail to MYSTERY@OMGC.INFO with one letter from the alphabet in the SUBJECT line. Only 1 letter of the alphabet at a time please. No other text is necessary.

The pictures and questions for that LETTER will be sent to you via reply email.

Once you look at the pictures, and do a bit of thinking and research, and find the answers, send your answers back by replying to the message. Your answers will be reviewed & judged for accuracy.

This way, you don't have to attempt every opportunity in the alphabet all at once – just work on them one at a time; perhaps one every couple of days (to keep busy during the COVID-19 restrictions).

A Bit Of Information About The Three Virtual Rally Runs Offered to OMGC Folks — Len Fortin

Over the last 10 months you may have seen the various broadcast messages about Virtual Rally Runs for Ottawa MG Club members. These Virtual Rally Runs were created to encourage club members to participate in "stay-athome driving rallies", as the actual gathering and driving such rallies wasn't a wise thing to do, considering the COVID-19 situation. One such rally was offered in April/May 2020; another in November/December 2020 and the third in January/February 2021.

The April/May 2020 "MG Rally Without Actually Driving Your MG" had half a dozen participants venture into the Internet with Google & Google Maps & other tools to "drive" the course and answer the 20 questions along the way.
